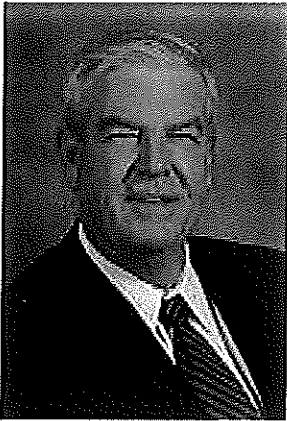

Senator David Boutin

(R-Hooksett)

Senate District 16



Sen. David Boutin was first elected to the New Hampshire Senate during a special election held in February of 2010. Eleven months later, he went on to win a full term in November of 2010 and was re-elected in 2012. He represents District 16 which covers Bow, Candia, Dunbarton, and Manchester Wards 1, 2 and 12 along with his hometown of Hooksett.

Boutin previously served as a state Representative serving Manchester Ward 1 from 1996-2000 and then returned to the legislature winning a special election to represent the town of Hooksett in the House of Representatives from 2008-2010.

Currently, Sen. Boutin chairs both the Capital Budget and Public & Municipal Affairs Committees. He is also a member of Judiciary and Transportation.

For the 2013-2014 legislative session, the senator's legislative priorities include: passage of a balanced budget without raising new or increased taxes or fees; finding a bipartisan, fiscally responsible and balanced solution(s) to the current inadequacies of both the men's and women's prison that result in inefficient expenditures to keep those facilities operating; expansion of the I-93 finishing the widening project from Exit 3 to Manchester; adopting E-Court funding in the Capital Budget; passage of pro-business, job-creating legislation including expansion of the Net Operating Loss provision; permanent adoption of the Research and Development Tax Credits and continued work on legislation that will help small business get relief from ever-increasing health care costs.

Additionally, Sen. Boutin will continue his work on behalf of hard-working families and small businesses that are struggling in these difficult economic times by fighting against new and or increased taxes and fees. The senator also believes that incentivizing small business to grow, invest and create new jobs that get people back to work is the best approach to restoring the "New Hampshire Advantage".

A leader in his community, Boutin served on the Hooksett Town Council, Zoning Board and Heritage Commission. He also has served on the Manchester Airport Access Study

Task Force, the Manchester Planning Board, and the Historic District Commission. From 1984-1986, he served on the Salem Budget Committee as a resident of that town.

Senator Boutin, who is retired, holds a bachelor's degree in Economics from Northeastern University and a master's degree in Community Planning and Development from the University of Rhode Island. He is also a 1996 graduate of Leadership New Hampshire.

David is married with two children and two grandchildren.

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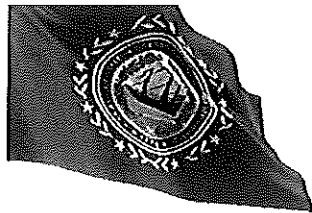
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Senator Lou D'Allesandro (D-Manchester)

Senate District 20



Sen. Lou D'Allesandro is from Manchester, the state's largest city, and has been serving the people of District 20 for eight terms. For the 2013-14 legislative session, he is Vice Chairman of Ways & Means. He also sits on Finance and Capital Budget.

D'Allesandro has been a familiar face in New Hampshire government for many years. He served the people of New Hampshire for three terms as an executive councilor and for two terms as a member of the New Hampshire House of Representatives.

In 2011, Sen. D'Allesandro received the first-ever Walter R. Peterson Citizen Leader Award named after the state's late governor. The award honors an individual each year for his or her extraordinary commitment to public service, selfless contributions to higher education, sense of humor and high moral character.

In addition to his career in public service, the senator has enjoyed professional success in the field of education. He holds an honorary doctorate from Daniel Webster College as well as honorary degrees from Franklin Pierce University and the New Hampshire Institute of Art. He is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and holds a masters degree in education from Rivier University. He was awarded the Caroline Gross Fellowship to attend the program for Senior Executives in State and Local Governments at Harvard University and two other post-graduate programs there. Currently, the senator serves as adjunct faculty at St. Anselm College teaching a course on state and local government.

An active member of the local community, D'Allesandro has served in many civic capacities, including as a volunteer with the National Council on Alcoholism and as a member of the Manchester Board of School Committee. He is a member of The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Inc., and is a director of the New Hampshire Hockey Hall of Fame. Additionally, he currently serves as a member of the board of directors of Southern New Hampshire Services and Members First Credit Union and is the former vice chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Boston's board of directors.

Most recently, D'Allesandro served as chairman of the New England Board of Higher Education, a congressionally authorized interstate compact designed to encourage cooperation among New England-based colleges and universities. Established in 1955, the organization and its programs are principally focused on the relationship between New England higher education and regional economic development.

D'Allesandro and his wife Patricia recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. They have three children and nine grandchildren and one great grandchild.

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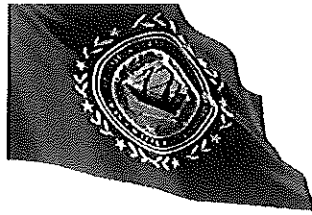
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Senator Andy Sanborn (R-Bedford)

For the current 2013-14 legislative session, he is Chairman of the Commerce Committee. He also serves on Capital Budget and Health, Education & Human Services.

With a background in banking and finance, Sen. Sanborn's entrepreneurial endeavors include operating in the hospitality, real estate development and machine prototyping industries among others. Presently he sits on the Dean's Advisory Board for Chief Justice John Broderick at UNH Law, Presidents Advisory Board at New England College, Business Finance Authority, Business to Government Modernization Committee, 2013 Legislative advisory Board of GOPAC, New Hampshire Canadian Trade Council, NH International Trade Council, Advisory Board for New Hampshire's unemployment system, the State of New Hampshire Capital Budget Overview Committee and is active with several charitable organizations. He is also a past member of the Board of Directors of the New Hampshire Lodging and Restaurant Association.

A graduate of New England College, with a focus on Finance, Economics and Marketing, Sanborn spent fifteen years working in commercial lending in New Hampshire going as far back as Indian Head Bank. He finished his corporate finance career in Chicago, overseeing a large international leasing company.

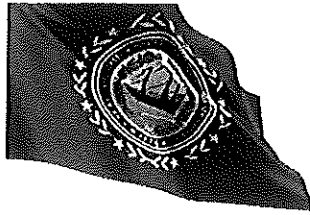
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Senator Donna Soucy (D-Manchester)

Sen. Donna M. Soucy is currently serving in her first term representing District 18, which is comprised of Wards 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 in the City of Manchester and the Town of Litchfield. Her committee assignments for the 2013-2014 legislative session include Executive Departments & Administration and Judiciary.

Sen. Soucy has a long history of public service, having been first elected to the New Hampshire House of Representatives in 1990. While in the House she served on the Municipal and County Government, Ways and Means, and Finance Committees. In addition, the Senator served two terms as an Alderman representing Ward 6 in the City of Manchester and she most recently served the people of Ward 6 as a member of the Board of School Committee for 7 ½ years. She also has the distinction of being the first female chair of the Manchester Fire Commission.

A lawyer, having practiced in both the public and private sector, Soucy also served as the Senate Chief of Staff from 2006 to 2010.

Who am I?

Bob Backus was born in 1939 and raised in Goffstown, NH. His father worked as a country doctor and his mother was active on the School Board.

As a young man, Bob often joined his father as he made house calls to patients. Bob often witnessed his father make many of these house calls without getting paid for the patients who couldn't afford it. It was on these visits that Bob gained a deep appreciation for the beauty of New Hampshire and a desire for helping his fellow man.

Bob attended both public school and the Holderness school. In high school Bob played football and tennis and was an award winning member of his high schools debate team.

Bob attended Wesleyan University for his undergraduate degree and received his law degree (cum laude) from Harvard University. When Bob returned to Manchester he chose to open his own law firm that would work for the people. It was nearly forty years ago that he opened the doors of Backus, Meyer and Branch so that he could represent citizen groups at low cost. In 2006, Bob ran for New Hampshire State Senate in District 16 where he came within 314 of upsetting the then Senate President Ted Gatsas. Despite the loss, Bob's strong campaign was credited with helping the Democratic party obtain the majority in both houses of the New Hampshire General Court.

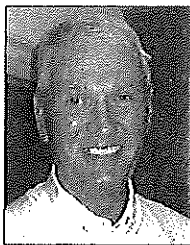

Dave is a New Hampshire native born, raised, and educated in Manchester. He is a graduate of Bishop Bradley High School (now Trinity High School) and received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Saint Anselm College where he majored in Political Science. He was later awarded a MBA from Rivier College in Nashua, NH. Following graduation Dave enlisted in the New Hampshire Army National Guard where he served for nearly 21 years. He served with the 197th Field Artillery Group Headquarters & Headquarters Battery, the New Hampshire Military Academy, and the 114th Public Affairs Detachment. In recognition of his work with the 114th PAD, he was awarded the Army Achievement Medal which recognized his "initiative, imagination, organization skills and leadership expertise..."

After release from active duty, Dave married Mary and they have resided in Bedford for nearly forty years. He has worked in the sales and marketing profession for local firms, most recognized were Edgcomb Steel of New England and Digital Equipment Corporation. Later he gained experience with telecommunication, residential real estate, web site development, and consulting engineering businesses. Most recently Dave has worked educating and representing interests of the public works profession. His firm, Foresee Advocacy, LLC, has been hired for programs in New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont.

Involved in municipal government for over twenty years, he has served the Bedford Planning Board for eight years, was elected to the Town Council for 4 terms or twelve years serving for a period as Chair. He has also represented Bedford on the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission where he served two years as Chair and currently is a member of the executive committee. He is also completing his third term as President of the New England Association of Regional Councils. His efforts on behalf of regional planning and cooperation include serving on the board of directors of the National Association of Regional Councils where he co-chairs the Energy and Environment Committee.

He was the vice-chair of the Manchester Young Republicans before moving to Bedford. In addition to serving as chair or co-chair for a number of state and national campaigns in Town he also served as the Chair of the Hillsborough County Republican Committee in the early 2000's. An adjunct faculty member of the Southern New Hampshire University for nearly thirty years he has represented adjunct faculty on the Faculty Senate and recently was recognized for Excellence in Teaching by the University. He continues to teach both undergraduate and graduate Continuing Education programs.

Recently he has been active with the public works profession serving on the New Hampshire Public Works Standards & Training Council, the New Hampshire Public Works Summit, and the New Hampshire Public Works Mutual Aid Program. He has served as Chair of the American Public Works Association Small Cities and Rural Communities Forum which represents communities of 50,000 and under.

He has advocated for small and rural municipalities and regions testifying before US Senate staff hearings. He spoke on the need for rural development funds at the Agricultural Committee, the need for specific inclusion of cities, towns, and regions under 250,000 in the Livable Communities Act, and participated in a 2010 White House Conference on Sustainable Communities. In addition, he often testified to the New Hampshire Legislature on behalf of the New Hampshire Association of Regional Councils and the public works groups that he supported.

Issues

- **The Environment**

Who is Emily Sandblade: a list of frequently asked questions and answers

Q. Why are you running for office?

A. I'm very concerned about what is happening to Manchester. There's an increasing number of empty storefronts on Elm Street, and that's just a hint of the huge increase in empty office space around the city. Since the business tax base is weaker, it means that an increasing amount of taxes must be paid for through property tax. This means higher rents and higher costs of home ownership for almost everybody. While there are some people in Manchester who can afford large property tax increases, it's a burden for most people, especially seniors, the disabled, those on fixed incomes, and families that are already being stressed by increasing energy and food costs. I believe that during a recession, the city government has an obligation to tighten its belt, just as its residents have to control their own spending. Unfortunately, most of the current aldermen seem reluctant to do so. Several of them, including the current Ward 11 alderman, put a measure on the ballot that weakens the spending and tax cap. I oppose this. It's time to stop the cycle of increasing spending in good times and increasing taxes in bad times.

Q. What makes you think you can break this cycle?

A. I've worked with taxpayer associations and on tax-control measures since 1994, when I first realized that taxes per person were going up much faster than the rate of inflation. In most cases, quality of service didn't increase proportionately, which means that we're paying more and getting less. This is so very contrary to the trend in the private sector, where the motivation is always to do more with less. The reason that Manchester's property taxes have increased by 50% over the last 10 years is because it's much easier just to pass a tax increase than it is to spend the time digging hard for ways to provide services more effectively and efficiently--or even to determine if a particular service really delivers what it's supposed to. Frankly, it doesn't appear that some of the people that we've elected have the analytical background to do cost/benefit analysis. I've built a business up from scratch and ran it for 16 years, so I understand accounting, cost control, and keeping customers happy. Because I'm scientifically trained in mathematics and physics, I also understand statistics, and have the capability to analyze the real data rather than merely accepting numbers that somebody quoted. For people who don't have an aptitude for math, it's too easy to be fooled by someone who throws numbers around. The problem is that there's plenty of that going on in Manchester's city government. When that happens, it's harder to see the real effects of legislative decisions until they're quite dramatic--like the very obvious losses of business and jobs in Manchester, as well as all the vacant homes and apartments.

Q. How long have you lived here?

A. About two years this time. I lived here when I was younger, but moved out-of-state to take care of my aging parents. After they died, I started looking for a more congenial place to live than the very liberal "people's republic" city that I was then living in. New Hampshire was on my very short list of 2 states. There were several convincing factors: the tremendous involvement by regular citizens in the state and local governments; the general skepticism of big government; and the obvious commitment of so many people to the ideals of this country's founders. Since I had lived in New Hampshire before and really liked it, I was inclined to move back. When I found out that there were other people moving to New Hampshire who also respected the values that this country was founded on, that really convinced me to move back. I feel very much at home here.

Q. Do you have family here?

A. Most of my family has been dispersed all over the country, mostly due to their careers. My niece is a student at SNHU. I think it's pretty sad that there aren't more career opportunities here, and I'd like to see all of New Hampshire--especially the Queen City--become a vibrant place for pursuing a career. If it doesn't happen soon, I fear my last close relative will find another opportunity out of state. So I have strong personal motivation to make Manchester very job friendly.

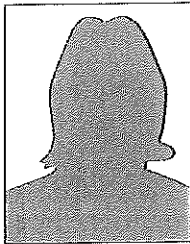
Q. What do you do for a living?

A. I'm currently working as a software engineer developing programs to teach math and science to junior high and high school students. I have also worked as a college instructor and in research laboratories, in addition to starting and running a computer software development business.

Q. What do you do in your spare time?

A. I wish I had more of that! I read about 100 to 150 books a year, knit, sew, garden, bicycle, cross-country ski, participate in neighborhood cleanups, find jobs for kids, and give machine knitting lessons to kids. Every year I try to squeeze in some online classes so I can stay competent in my job. If I had more time, I'd like to learn how to do gourmet cooking, and I dream about setting up a kid's summer computer/math/science camp.
